Mick Symons is Executive Director, Investigation Division, Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) in New South Wales.

Before being appointed to his current position, Mick Symons was Chief Superintendent with the South Australia Police, and led the Major Crime Investigation Branch in investigating homicide, abduction, and serious criminal activities. He also led the Anti Corruption Branch. He has extensive experience in the investigation of all aspects of corruption (police and public sector), organized crime, paedophilia, and major drug offences.

Mr Symons has a Master of Business Administration, a Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice, a Graduate Diploma in Public Administration (Policing), a Graduate Diploma in Fraud Investigation, a Graduate Certificate in Management, a Law Degree (Hons) and a BBus (Marketing) Degree. He has been admitted to the South Australian and New South Wales Bar to practice in those States. In the course of his duties at ICAC he also appears, on occasions, as Counsel for the Commission in compulsory examinations as part of investigations. He is currently studying for a Masters degree in International Law and International Relations. He has lectured in graduate courses at Hong Kong University and at ANU on corruption investigation and prevention. He is a Visiting Fellow (Teaching) at ANU.
